A guide to child restraints

Since 11 March 2010, all children up to seven years of age must be secured in a child restraint.

A child may stop using a child restraint once they turn seven years of age or once they have outgrown the restraint. At that stage they can

legally sit on an adult seat and use the adult seat belt. The new child restraint laws have been introduced to improve children's safety and ensure that they are secure in the right restraint for their age. The child restraint must comply with the Australian Standard (AS1754 or AS/NZS1754). An approved child restraint will display an Australian Standards tick logo.



Age: Birth – 6 months

Age: 6 months – 1 year



Infants may travel rear or forward facing until they outgrow the restraint by height or weight

Kidsafe recommends that babies are safer travelling rearward facing as long as possible – until they outgrow the restraint. Babies should not travel forward facing until they have a strong neck.

Age: 6 months – 4 years

Age: 4-7 years



Kids travel in a booster with an adult seat belt OR H-harness until they outgrow the booster by height or weight

The penalty for incorrect restraint or no restraint is a \$300 fine and 3 demerit points
