Alice sits down near a box of books and carefully arranges five little ducks on the floor in front of her. Then she chooses a book and concentrates reading to her duck audience. Meanwhile baby Takshay is playfully on the mat behind her listening to her story too.

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Pips enjoy playing with the wall caterpillar, rotating the eyes, moving elements along the bent wires, moving the hands of the analogue clock, learning colours, day times and seasons. This play helps the development of hand-eye coordination, visual and tactic perception, motor skills, concentration, recognition of cause and effect and more...



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
