

Miss Sammie's Secret Ingredients







- ½ Cup Rolled Oats
- ¼ Cup Quick Oats
- 1 1/2 Cup Self Raising Flour
- 1 tsp Sugar
- Pinch of Salt

Enough Milk to make a batter

Fresh Berries



Method:

- Put all dry ingredients into a large bowl and mix them.
- Add milk slowly until the batter combined well and become a smooth batter.
- Allow the batter rest for 20 minutes and fry in real butter about a tea spoon per pancake.
- Serve with fresh berries on the top.

Pre- Kindy

Here's an update on a few things going on in the room lately.

Letter recognition — we have been working on letters, sounds and the alphabet in general, well we have been working on this slowly for most of the year. We tend to use a bit of repetition and serve this in a fun, play based setting — because learning IS fun. I have added in name recognition cards with photos to aid children learning what their name looks like in preparation for Kindergarten. I am making just plain name cards for the children to practice and extend on further.


Numeracy – we sing lots of song with numbers and count by fingers. I have purchased tens boards to bring numeracy into the play area, the children have been using stones and crystals to sort and count.

The Arts – We have a fully stocked arts area where the children can take their own paper and pencils off the shelf to draw when they like. We display the artwork in the cupboards at the back of the room and artwork is also placed in the children's portfolios to take home at the end of the year. One thing we love to do is to ask the children to describe what they are painting, building creativity and vocabulary.

Senses – we have worked hard to bring in new resources to the room that not only look pleasing but feel wonderful. We have plants, fur, crystals, stones, linen, wool, wood and lots of natural resources that the children can bring to the tables and engage in. We love how the children are touching and seeing these activities and move towards them to play with.

Where to from here — I want to be trying something new, which I haven't done in an educational setting before, and that is to create a seasonal table. Our first stone will be based on Spring. I am asking families to bring in natural objects with their children that remind them of Spring to be placed on the table with love and reverence. This table will be used for learning during Group Times, to aid in discussion and bring your input in. We have started reading stories pertaining to seasons and extending to the cycle of the year. The table will be Halloween, then Summer, then Christmas. \odot


